

Narrative Outline

Mechanics

- Applications must include the following sections in the numbered order given.
- Do not exceed the five-page maximum for the narrative part of your application.
- No additional material or appendices will be considered nor will any material be returned.
- Type or word process in 12-point font or larger
- Use Bookman, Helvetica or Times font. Single space lines and keep margins to 1 inch.
- Do not state names of applicants, school or town in narrative.

1. Title
2. Abstract (No more than 150 words)
3. Description of Project (Up to 1500 words)
 - Activities proposed or completed
 - Ways in which the activities meet the CECA Goals and Vision Statement
 - How the activities address the CT Framework K-12 Curricular Goals and Standards
 - Ways in which the activities have been or will be evaluated
4. In What ways does the project exemplify innovative curriculum or the use of technology as an agent of pedagogical change? (Up to 500 words)
5. How can the activities be modeled and replicated in other educational settings? (No more than 150 words)
6. How can the activities be adapted for different educational settings?

Criteria

Proposals will be evaluated on the following basis:

- How effectively it supports the CECA Goals and Vision Statement – Up to 50 points
- Innovative curriculum or the use of technology as an agent of pedagogical change – Up to 25 points
- Ease of modeling and replicating – Up to 12 points
- Ease of adaptation to alternative settings – Up to 12 points

For otherwise equally proposals, membership in CECA will provide a tiebreaker.
